1. Recap on National Social Target for Poverty Reduction

- Headline target: 4 per cent rate of consistent poverty by 2016 and 2 per cent or less by 2020
 - extended timeframe to take account of recession;
 - bring timing in line with EU reporting
- Sub-targets for children and jobless households planned
- Europe 2020 target: reduce by minimum of 200,000 (4.4 per cent) the population in 'combined poverty'
- New name:
 - Reflect view that a reduction poverty needs to go beyond income support system

2. Summary of main implementation actions





a. Communicating with stakeholders

- Publication of review & supporting documents
- National Roundtable with stakeholders in November 2012
- Social Inclusion Forum (new slot to facilitate stronger engagement by NGOs in policy debates and reporting on poverty)
- Senior Officials Group on Social Policy/Cabinet
 Ctte on Social Policy
- European Commission



b. Better outcomes through analysis & research (1/2)

- DSP/ESRI study published in December 2012 examining links between poverty and work
- Highlighted problem of "jobless households"
 - quarter of total population aged 0-59 (already a pre-existing structural problem but worsened by recession)
 - 2.5 times EU average
 - High risk group of poverty and social exclusion (75 per cent of consistent poverty population; i.e. 5.1% of 6.9 per cent CP rate in 2011
- Subject of poverty sub-target
- Actions to address problem in context of rollo-out of Pathways to Work and Intreo



- b. Better outcomes through analysis & research (2/2)
- Social Impact Assessment: greater awareness of policy impact on poverty
 - SIA of Budget 2013 to be published soon
 - Work with other Govt depts to apply social impact assessment (eg, new health and wellbeing policy of Dept of Health)
 - Other measures to make more effective (welcome input through workshops)



c. Monitoring outcomes

- Social Inclusion Monitor: monitor of progress towards target in transparent way
- Includes material on targets (4), supporting indicators (5), & indicators on vulnerable groups & issues
- Inaugural Monitor only covers 2010-2011;
- Format and content to be kept under review



d. Reporting on actions and outcomes

- Annual report on National Action Plan for Social Inclusion (new online format being prepared)
- National Social Report for EU Social Protection
 Ctte as part of Social OMC
- National Reform Programme under the Europe 2020 strategy (poverty target)



Working towards new national calendar - overview



Reporting on the National Reform Programme

- EU2020 target: reduce by minimum of 200,000 (4.4 per cent) the population in 'combined poverty' (3 national indicators; similar to EU population 'at risk of poverty or exclusion')
- Reports on progress using developmental welfare state/active inclusion framework:
 - focus of workshops at SIF today
 - Access to minimum income support (income adequacy and prevention of poverty)
 - Activation and employment (unemployment and jobless households)
 - Access to services (children, older people)
