

*BRENNAN URGES WIDE PARTICIPATION AS CONSULTATION TAKES PLACE
IN CARLOW FOR NEXT ACTION PLAN ON POVERTY*

Following the launch of an extensive consultation process earlier this month by the Minister for Social Affairs, Seamus Brennan T.D., the Office for Social Inclusion now invites participants to the next in a series of regional consultation seminars which takes place on 9 November in the Seven Oaks Hotel, in Carlow. These consultations will assist in the development of Ireland's National Action Plan against Poverty and Social Exclusion 2006-2008 (NAP/inclusion).

Ireland, together with the other 24 EU Member States, is due to present its Action Plan to the EU Commission next September, as part of an EU wide drive to honour the pledge made at Lisbon in 2000 "to make a decisive impact on poverty" by 2010. Ireland's action plan, when completed within the next year, will establish the priorities that should be addressed up to 2008.

Minister Brennan encourages a wide range of community and voluntary organisations and groups, both national and local, to attend this seminar. The nationwide public consultation seminars also provide those who are not directly involved with the social partnership process with an opportunity to contribute their views on, and experiences of, the implementation of the National Anti-Poverty Strategy.

Minister Brennan is looking forward to getting a wide range of views on the policy changes and developments necessary to continue the substantial progress being made to tackle poverty and, in particular, to establish the priorities up to 2008. The Minister would like the next

National Action Plan to be focused and to sharply reflect the experience, views and priorities of Irish society in meeting one of our greatest challenges-that of building not just a prosperous, but a fair society, which values and supports all people, and particularly the most vulnerable.

Mullingar, 29 November at Mullingar Park Hotel
